The erosion-carved figure depicted on the front cover is known as the "Kneeling Camel", one of many such formations found in PALO DURO CANYON STATE PARK in the Texas Panhandle.

Palo Duro was discovered in 1541 by Coronado in his trek across the Llano Estacado. Dubbed "The World's Most Colorful Canyon", it has remained little known until recent months. Rapidly, however, it is acquiring nationwide fame and is attracting thousands of tourists annually.

Erosion-created by a stream now known as the Prairie Dog Town Fork of Red River, Palo Duro (Indian for "hard wood" from the strong cedar branches from which the Indians made their arrows) is 90,000 years old. It slices 300 million years deep into the earth's crust. More than 20 miles across at its widest point and 120 miles long, its floor is 1120 feet beneath the level of the plains out of which it was carved.

Easily reached by sightseeing buses, which connect with Burlington trains, Palo Duro Canyon is located about 30 miles from Amarillo, Texas, one of the principal cities on the Burlington Lines' ZEPHYR route between the Gulf Coast and the Rocky Mountains. Amarillo is served twice daily by the famous TEXAS ZEPHYR. The first Diesel-powered, streamline passenger train into Amarillo, the TEXAS ZEPHYR, with its sister trains, the SAM HOUSTON ZEPHYR and the CALIFORNIA ZEPHYR, link the fabled Texas Panhandle with the remainder of the glorious, modern West.
